He was shot through the head just after stand-down on the morning of June 25. at Messines. The bullet went in at his temple and out of his cheek. I saw him shot as he stood in the trench where he was observing. His body was buried in the cemetery not far from the bottom of Messines Ridge.

He belonged to VIII Platoon. B. Co. and came from Camberwell, Victoria. I knew him very well.
