Pte. Randall died on May 3rd soon after admission. He had been severely wounded in the buttock. He left no message. He was buried at Grevillers.

I was within a few yards of him when he was hit by a shell during our advance at Bullecourt on May 3rd, just when we had reached our 2nd objective. I am an S/B. and when I saw Randall fall I went to him and found he was dead. His body was left where he fell. I came over with him from Australia in the 17th Reinforcements. He was a New South Wales man very short only about 5 ft. 4. I do not know what Coy. he belonged to.

About 2 or 3 men from the Randall was when he was shot at Bullecourt before reaching the Fritz Trenches. We took the ground but cannot say anything about burial.

At Bullecourt just befor we hopped over on May 3rd a shell came, killing about 6 in all, and among them was Randell. The Germans counter attacked that time, and we were coming back Smith was killed on the Sunken Road. His body was left, as we had the Germans close after us.

Pte Randall died on May 3rd 1917

on admission: He had been severely
wounded in the buttock. G.

6137 Pte V. G. Gray ^{12th Nov} came in on Easter
Monday, suffering from compound fracture
of the skull, he died the next day.

Neither of these patients left or could
leave any message. Both were buried
at Grévillers. H.

I did not write, ^{probably} as we have from
the notes, to Gray's next of kin, as
we could not find out anything about
them. H
