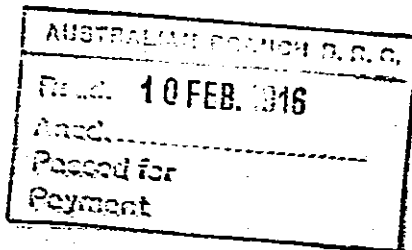

In your letter of 8.1.16 you mention not having received a report regarding 173 Pte H.T.Scott, 12th Battn, as well as the address of the inquirer (Rev. Hayer).
