"Killed in Action 3-6.11.16"

Re your letter 19.12.17.

On receipt of your cable 9.5.17 this case was sent to H.Qrs. for verification and on 14.5.17 we were told that he was killed 3-6.11.16, and that his initial was B. Owing to a printer's error the casualty appeared in our current list as killed 14.5.17 - and as this mistake was not discovered either by us or by yourselves it has not been corrected. Had the correct casualty been printed it would of course have been cancelled in November last with the other casualties of Nov. 1916.

We much regret that a mistake in this office should have lessened the chance of obtaining information for Pte. Phillips' relatives, especially as they left their enquiry so late, and after the spring fighting it was already difficult to get particulars of 1916 casualties. We are verifying his Christian name at H.Q. and will enquire there again in the hope of getting some particulars of burial.
