"I saw Postlethwaite put on a stretcher after he was killed by a shell at Stormy trench, Nr. Guendecourt. He was killed in my part of the line in a Barrage. I did not see him hit but his death must have been instantaneous. He was buried next morning (Feb: 15/17) at Chalk Cliffs Cemetry, near Guendecourt and a cross erected with Name, Battalion, and Religion on it. I would have written to his people but had no address. He came over with me and I knew him well."

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He was killed by a shell in the front line trench before Gueudecourt Wood on the Somme. He was carried to the mouth of the dugout on a stretcher, but he died ten minutes later. He was buried close to the Chalk Pits in the open and his grave was marked with a cross and I have visited it. He was of my Company.

On the night of the 14th February our batta. was in a trench cap Stured some time previous. Fritz was in the same trench to our right and the 57th A.I.F. were in it still further to the right. We were raiding Fritz out of the intervening strip of trench, meanwhile his cartillery was shelling us very severely. I was on an observation post and Postlethwalte was on the next one to me not more than 10 yards away. I saw a shell himst on the next one to me not more than 10 yards aray. I saw a sholl burst on the parados right behind him. It wounded me. Then all was confusion. I went to the dugout to get my wound aressed. The dupout was full and while there I saw 8/8s. dressing a man's wounds on the entrance stops. The 8/8 told me it was Postlethwaite. He said he had a frightful wound in his back and could not last long. He did not lest more than a quarter of an hour. I did not know Postlethwaite, not even by sight. It was the 5/B who told no who the man was who was next to me in the trench and who died on the step. He said he and his mates would do their best to get all the dead back and give them a decent burial. I do not know what became of his body. The 8/8's name was Pte.J.Jackson.R.Cov.now a M.gumner and still with B.Coy. The other S/B handling Postlethwaite was Pte. Butterworth of B.VIII. now in England sounded. S/E Jackson said he had taken his paybook and yould give it to the Coy.clerk\_FEF. Cpl.R.Maddern but I see he is missing now.

Portlethwaite was out with a wiring party at night at Gueudecourt. He was shot through the head and died immediately. He is buried behind the lines there. There is a cross put up over his grave with his name on it.

#### "Killed 14.2.17."

In reference to the deseased soldier A.E.POSTLETHVAITE who was killed in Action I cannot give full particulars as to the registration of his grave but I can safely say that he was buried in the presence of yself and two or three more stretcher bearers at a place called Guedecourt along with three or four more of his mates. It was not a soldiers cemetery and you would need to apply to the O.C. Graves Registry Office. He was unconscious from the time he was wounded right up till he died-it was a most seven wound through the shoulder and out through the spine.
