He belonged to VI Pl. B.Oo. I saw him killed at Posieres on the first Sunday in August. (Aug.6th.) A shell burst in the trench and blew his chest in, killing him outright. His body weak buried in the trench, close to where he fell. He was the only man of this name in B.Oo. He used to be a barber. I think he came from Eudges, E.S.V.
