I know a Private Jack Quinn in C. Co. - He came with the 17th to 18th Reinforcements from Sydney. He is about 28 years of age, nuggety, stout, fair, clean-shaven, married and has a peculiar disposition. He is in the 'Clink' doing two years. I last saw him at Bapaume about 8 days ago. I do not know any other Quinn in the Battalion.
