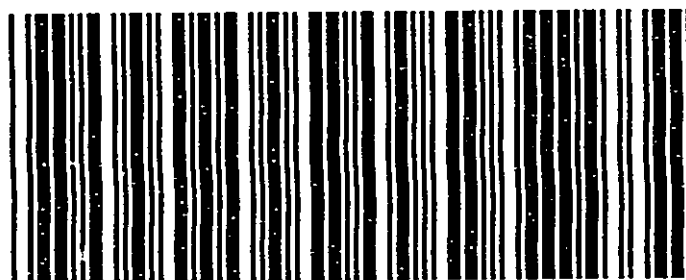

Informant states that on the 23rd July 1916 at Pozieres when on duty as stretcher bearer picking up wounded in No Man's Land I saw the body of Pte. Schofield lying in a shell hole. He must have been killed about midnight the 22nd. The burial party came round later and probably buried him.

He was not killed till October. He was killed at Ypres in the lines by a Minenwerfer at the Bluff on 10th October he was buried at Ypres with Major Rowland, Sergt. Hobson and L/Cpl. Powell.

I saw Schofield's remains. They would be buried close by. Major Rowlands and Sgt. Hobson were killed by the same shell."
