

Informant states that on 20th July 1916 at about 8.30 a.m. Capt. Robertson rallied his men together in a final desperate effort to bomb the German trenches and was killed. Informant declares that he went out of his mind, as his conduct was most peculiar. He is said to have started bombing his own men instead of the Germans. He had previously been badly wounded in the head."

July 20th 1916.

He was O.C. of A. Company, and I saw him fall in "No Man's Land" on July 19th 1916 at Fleurbaix, just in front of the German wire. He fell straight into a shell hole and doubled up as if dead. I was right next to him at the time whilst we were advancing. I shook him to see if he was alive, but could get no answer so went on. He was the only Cart. Robertson in the regiment and am quite sure it was he. The Germans never advanced to the place where I left him.
