Re No. 2224. Pyte. H. Rae. 19th. Battalion. A.I.F.

I would be very much obliged if you would make enquiries with regard to the whereabouts of the above named soldier who is, I have reason to believe, wounded and a prisoner of war.

In a letter I received from another mate in the 19th. Battalion, it was mentioned that Rae was seen to have been wounded and pulled into the German's trench by them.

If it is possible for you to find out, I would very much like to know any further particulars, when and where he was wounded, if he has been officially reported as "Missing, believed wounded and a prisoner of war" and whether it is possible to find out where he is interned and if I can write to him.

If it is permissible for me to write to him and you can supply me with the address of the Internment Camp, please tell me through what channels I would have to forward any correspondence and what is allowed to be written in the letter.
