Informant was a tent-mate of Parkinson's. He was called 'Harry'. His Mother used to live at Mosman - Informant saw her at Kensington Camp. Parkinson was about 5 ft. 10 ins., dark, about 25 years of age.

On Monday, second day of landing, Informant's Section, including Parkinson, was advancing opposite Shrapnel Gully, and Informant last saw Parkinson when they started to retire. It was a rough scramble back - they had reached the Turks' trenches, but could not get in. When the Section rounded up about three-quarters of a mile from the Beach, Parkinson was missing. He must have fallen in the retirement, or been captured by the Turks.

Parkinson was a general favourite, and there were many enquiries made for him, but nothing further could be ascertained.

Other tent-mates, who were in this action, were Jessop, Harris, Turner, Creker, Vivian Dunshay and Corporal Burns. Mrs. Parkinson has a photo of them.
