In reply to your enquiry for the letails of the death and burial of 3429 Ptc. E.J. Westley 38th Battalion A.I.F. we beg to inform you that we have just received an unofficial report about him from 2612 Cpl E.T. Poppins of the same unit. He stated that he saw Westley killed instantaneously by a machine gum bullet in the head, about 8 a.m. on 31-818, during an attack between Clercy and Bont St Quentin. He was buried where he fell, and Cpl Poppins added that he had taken a photo maph of his grave.

He described Pte Hestkey as being about 23 to 24 years old, fair and of medium height.

Pte.E. J. WESTHY. 38th Buttalion. A.I.F. We beg to advise you that we have received a further unofficial report about him from 1043 Sgt. J.W. Crinton of the same Unit interviewed recently in France. He stated that he was with your brother when he was killed by machine gun bullet on 31.7.18 between 8 & 9 s.m. during an attack near Mont St. Quentin. Agt. Grinston added that your brother was buried near where he fell and that he had a photograph of the grave. Our informant described Pte. Westley as a fair, ruddy faced man of medium height, about 5.9m. Should we obtain further particulars we will advise you immediately.
