

# "Killed in Action 4-7-18"

Height 5ft 7, fair, stout build, age about 28, single. On July 4th 1918 at Pear Trench, Hammel, I saw the body of Pte Williams and recognised him. He was in the same platoon (3.A.Coy) as myself. A piece of shell had gone through his head and death must have been instantaneous. Pte.F.G.Williams of same platoon told me he had afterwards buried him where he lay.

"He was killed on July 4th about 4.35 a.m. by a small shell which also wounded me. Was buried just on the left of Pear trench in front of Hamel for or between Hamel and Hamelet with a few others of our boys. The Btn records do not show whether the graves were registered or not, however seeing there were others buried there no doubt it will not be hard to find out. As to his identification am enclosing letter and card from his Mother who I wrote on recovering from my own wound to whom I have given all particulars.
