ame Pte F.W.Page of Walsh Street Marceba-Australia, 3069 A.Co.4th Platt. 15th Batt. A.I.F. says: - On the 8th Aug.last, the 15th Batt. A.I.F. was with others ordered to attack a German Treach about 400 yards behind Pozieres. We went over the parapet about 9.20.p.m. and at about 9.50. y.m. the German Trench was reached. The 5 men as per list annexed with 8 others whose names I do not remember as they were new drafts to the 15th Batt. Gelonged to A.Coy.4th Plat. to which I also was attached. Sgt. P E Sherman was in charge of this section and in the attack they came up to a part of the German Trench which had not been damaged; Immediately in front of them was e very strong m/g emplacement which it was impossible for the men to attack. I saw a German stand on the parapet and give our men a chan ce to surrender. Sat. Sherman who could speak German (his father was a German) shouted to the German in German and immediately afterwards he and the 12 men disappeared in the German trench. When this happened I was about 30 yards behind as I could not keep up () with the plat. deing somewhat impeded by the telephone apparatus which as a signaller I carried round my waist. Although it was night at the time, the star shells made it as light as day. I am quite

The trench scon after this event was taken and held for a short time when it was evacuated. It was exacuated on the 9th sug. and taken and held. The Germans holding the trench were the 59th Prussian Guard, I know this because some of them were captured by our men. I have written to the sister of J.R. Douglas telling her that her brother was a prisoner with the Germans I should have written to the relatives of the others but did not know their addresses. Pte F.H.
