

"I was in the searching party that went out to look for the men we had been compelled to leave behind after the attack on March 20th. We found Whitehead, he had been killed by a shell, we buried him close at hand."

"When we were trying to take the village of Vaulx Roreuil (Arras) in Parch Pte Whitehead (23 C.) was reported missing. Later others took this place and we went back in April salveging and found his body. I saw them bury him, where they found him. They were being shelled at the time, so had to go back a few days afterwards with a cross they had made. He was a runner."

Wilson of C.Co., was in the charge of a fatigue party of which I was one, at Horeuil. He found this man's body, and the sergt took the disc. His brother was told about it. He appeared to have been killed outright.

We buried him there? A cross was put up later by the company. I knew him well: he was batman to the O.O. of the company. He was 5'3"; thickset, very fair; cleanshaven, about 20; single I think.

I knew Pte. A.H. Whitehead. He was reported missing on March 20th 1917 after a fight at Nourell Village. About 3 weeks or so after the fight I was one of a burial party sent out to bury the dead I did not actually take part in burying Whitehead but I was told by the others that his body had been found and that he was buried with other Australian soldiers.

I did not see him killed but saw his grave about 200 yards from the Church at Favrieul, there was a cross made by the boys up, a home made cross, by the boys in Battalion. He came over from Aust. with me. We were camped near I and I went over to the grave.

# Killed in action 20/3/17.

"I knew Cannelty. He was a man about 5ft 5 ins. well built, about 22 years of age, known as "Whiey". He was a 9th Riots. man of the 23rd Btn. Casualty was advancing at Roreuil and was a runner. I was in the same advance. I did not see Casualty killed but non coming back later on I saw him lying dead between yaux and Noreuil. He was buried just where he fell and I helped to bury him."
