

On the morning of the 14th Jampary 1917, Captain B. Gibson A.A. M. C. was bathing in the sac at Hod Massid, Egypt and was carried out beyond the breakers over 100 yards from shore the sea being very rough, Signal Corporal R.A. Wheaton Australian Light Horse, swam out and susseeded in bringing him to shore but unfortunately he did not recover.

Bronse Medal awarded 13th March 1917.

Next of kin of the above soldier,, who was officially reported to have Died of Wounds on the 23rd April, 1917; has received a medal presented and forwarded by the Royal Humane Society for rescuing life at sea.
