Missing 1st February 1917

L/Cpl. Young was in C. Company, 12th Platoon. He was a friend of mine. I enquired about three or four weeks ago about him. A man of the name Holloway in the Orderly Room told me that all pay-book, discs and other things had been found.

He was in C Co., 12th platoon. In an attack at Guedecourt near the Chalk Pits at 7 at night, we held the ground for 8 hours and were relieved first thing in the morning. He was missing then. Since then his paybook and disc are reported in the regiment as having been found by one of the 46th battalion, a few days after, and returned to C Company Orderly Room. I believe this information is correct.

"I believe that L/Cpl. George Young (15.,C.,XII) was killed, and that he was found about three weeks after the attack at Guebdecourt. His pay book was taken and returned to the Battalion. Three other men who had been killed, were found at the same time. L/Cpl. Harry Taylor (15.C.XII), Pte. Harry Shaw (15.,C.,XII), and Pts. Walter Clark (15.,C.,XII).

The 15th Battalion Orderly Room Sgt. would confirm this, but I cannot remember his name. The attack was made at 7 p.m. on Feb. 1st. We took some ground but we were driven out again about 4 a.m. on Feb. 2nd. The 13th Batt: took the same ground a few days later."

I knew L.Cpl. Geo. C. Young of C.Co., XIII. Fltn. He came from Bundaberg, Queensland. His father has a Dairy. Sergt. Peter Drummond of C.Co., XIII. Fltn. (Platoon Sergt.) who is now in Hospital in England with his leg off, told me that he saw Young lying dead at Gueudecourt on February 2nd. 1917.
