"Died of Wounds 1-10-17"

Pte.C.D.Williams. No 7340. He went out on a strong post with six others and was badly wounded and also buried. He was dug out and carried into the front trench on a stretcher but he was unconscious and died before we reached the first Aid Post and as there were lots of more wounded he was layed on the side, and two men went and buried him later in the day. He was not buried in a soldiers cemetery but his name was temporary put up. The man I am referring to was only with us about one month. He was a reinforcement to the eighth Battalion but was transferred to the 23rd Battalion with a few others. He was about 5ft 6. in height, fair complexion, and fairly good build, His watch and ring was handed to me of the officers.
