Casualty died of wounds at the Dressing Station, received in the line whilst inspecting Aid Posts with the 13th or 7th Field Ambulance. He was transferred from the unit a couple of days before Christmas 1917. Military Funeral held, quite a number of the 8th Field Ambulance attending. Buried near Albert. On the 22nd September, 1918, a memorial service was held in honour of the men who had fallen in the Ambulance, by Corporal Cosier. A most impressive service, he spoke about each man.
