

I knew Skehan for six months; he was small, medium build, smart, dark, and about 25. On September 26th. 1917. the Battalion was at Polygon Wood and in action. He was killed by shell explosion, and was dead when we got to him. two minutes after. We had to carry on, and I did not see him again or hear of burial.

He was killed by a shell at Polygon wood, I saw his body soon after. He was buried in a shell hole near where he fell by a party from the company. No cross was erected at the time. He was a machine gunner, and was in No. 5. Platoon, B. Company. He was a clerk in the tobacco trade in Melbourne before enlisting.


