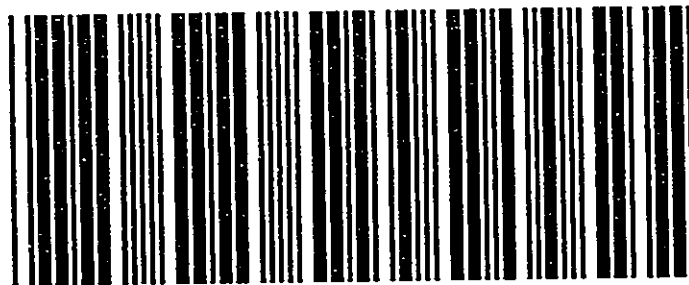

"Died of Illness 26-11-18"

Re No 2690. Pte Wyman. B.E. 1st Battalion. A.I.F.
Pte Wyman and a friend, Pte Webb, were attending a concert at Bohain when Wyman complained of feeling ill. He was taken to the R.A.P. of the Pioneer Battalion. and the Doctor pronounced him dead. A post mortem examination was held at the 50th C.C.S. and the cause of death attributed to natural causes.

Pte Wyman had not previously mentioned any serious complaint, but was known to have a cold or influenza. His grave is in the British Military Cemetery at Bohain. He was buried by the Chaplain from the 50th C.C.S. and a detachment of his comrades was present at the interment.
