Informant says ~~sa~~ "I saw Woodward drop, I think killed. He was never brought in. This was on the night of Aug. 6-7 after midnight, in an attack from Steel's Post on the German Officers' Observation trench. Woodward fell half-way between our trenches and theirs. It was very dark.
