I saw him lying in a trench, at Bullecourt badly wounded. He was hit about the Stomach with a piece of shell and was unconscious when I saw him. Soon after this the Germans ~~came to~~ attacked, and were forced to retire, and we left him there. According to his ^{corps} ~~section~~ when I saw him, I do not think there was any possible chance of saving him even if he was taken prisoner. I knew him very well, he came from S.A. he was engaged in farming prior to enlistment. He left Australia with me by the S.S. Scaughen? on the 12.7.16.
