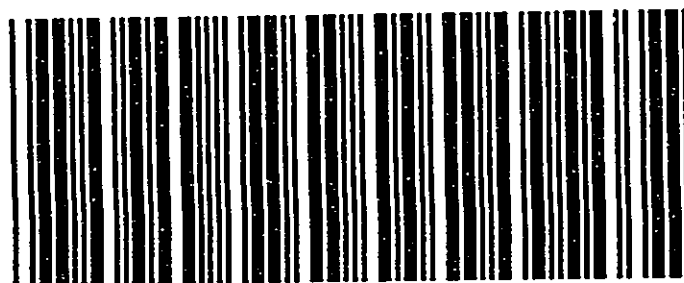

Witness states that on May 19th, during an attack by Turks on the Australian trenches he and Summers were near each other. About the end of May Summers volunteered for reconnaissance work and left the trenches with a patrol under Sgt Collingwood, and did not return. Witness knows nothing further. Pte Summers is said to have been in No 1 Platoon, described as a tall man about 6 feet in height.
