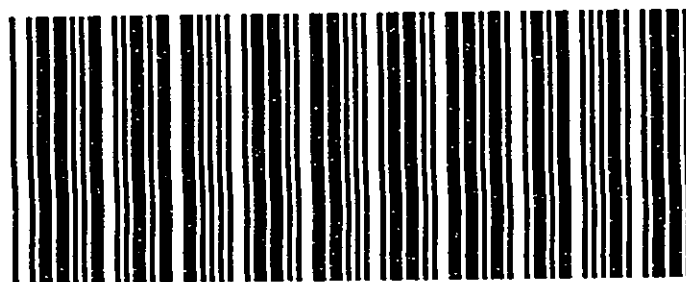

Sutherland Pte. N. 5483.

(Wounded & Missing Oct. 4.1917)

"I last saw Pte. Sutherland on the 4th Oct. 1917 at Passchendaele Ridge. We made an attack on the 4th October, the action was very severe. When I saw Pte. Sutherland he was lying dead in a captured German pill-box, he was hit all over the body and his tunic was torn. He had been hit early in the morning I believe and died in the evening some time before I saw him. I had a comrade with me at the time. I saw Pte. Sutherland, his name: Pte. A. Pride 6th Battn., D. Company, Aus. Imperial Force. His number I cannot remember. I took Pte. Sutherland's paybook from him and then we left him as he was, it was not possible at the time to bury him as the action was so severe. I had no time to look for his identity disc."

Description: Tall, no scars, no nickname as far as Informant knows.
