"Was missing from about 3th June, 1917. Battery position then in Ploegstreet. Died of wounds No. 2 C.C.S. at Steenwarck on 6th June, 1917. Believed by all to have been found by Tormy soldier in shell hole provious to his going to C.C.S. He was buried at Steenwarck H.Cemetery cross being erected by his Battery. Fred was his christian name (nickname Sturpy) Hedium build, dark hair, height about 5' 7 or 8" came from Eceman's Reach near Windsor, H.S.W. Left Sydney by troopship "Argylshire" on Thursday 11th Hay, 1916. Occupation in N.S.W. orchardist also spont a fair amount of his time in Queensland. Do not know where he was hit and was not an eye-witness".
