Re 2641 Pte. A.T. Smith, 33rd Battn. This man was admitted to this Hpl. on the 6-4-18, suffering from Gun Shot Wounds of the head, penetrating the skull, chest, and both arms and legs. He was in a very weak and collapsed condition on arrival here, and died within a few hours of admission. The remains were buried with the usual honours in the Town Cemetery of Abbeville, Somme, on the 8-4-18.

He was in a very weak and collapsed condition on arrival here and died within a few hours of admission.

The remains were buried with the usual honours in the Town Cemetery of Abbeville, Somme on the 8th April, 1918.
