Witness saw his body lying in a communication sap at Pozieres. He was probably killed by concussion as his body was quite whole, no mutilation. Would be buried in nearest shell hole. Knew him well as they were in the same platoon and there was no other man of that name.

Killed in Action 4/8/16

The abovenamed soldier was killed in action at Pozieres on the 4th August 1916. I myself did not see him fall and cannot therefore say how he was killed, but I believe that our platoon sergeant (Sgt. Nordon) now Lieut. Nordon, who was in charge of the platoon during the stunt, will be able to supply any desired information.

I am not aware of the present whereabouts of Lt. Nordon nor do I know his home address.
