I came over in the Euripedes with O.H. Stevens, landed in Plymouth October 9th 1916. I think he came from Wagga New South Wales. He was in the same Company with me. It was at Hermes 9th April 1917, it was reported that while in ration fatigue the party were hit by H.E. shell and Stevens had one leg blown off. He was taken to Dressing Station almost immediately. At the same time M. Harris, A Company, was wounded. He recovered and was with the Battalion 22nd September 1917 when I left.

"KILLED 9/4/17."

Stevens was in S Company, 5th Platoon, and was a late reinforcement either 20th or 21st. He was fairly tall, very young and fair, and had only recently joined us up. At Hermies on 9/4/17 - the day we took Hermies - he was sent up to the Cook House in the village after we had captured it, and was killed instantly on his way back. I did not see him after he fell but he was only about 100 yards away from us at the time. He was a pal of mine and I made special enquiries about him as soon as we got out that night. Private Bacon in the Sanitary Section told me he had seen Stevens killed and he said Stevens was killed instantly as he and another were carrying a dixie of tea. He would be buried near the village of Hermies.
