Towards dusk on 13th July 1917 a date he fixed with cetainty as he was on that day carried to the tent from Neuve Eddese on the Messines Hout suffering with appendicitis he perfectly remebers seeing Pye, Stibberd who was in the same Coy as himself standing near the HdQtrs. He does not know Stibbard's civil occupation. or where he came from but stated that he was batman to Captn. Lorgy of C. Coy was about 22 and had reddish hair. Note Myseacher. Stibbard was a Corcoral when he was killed at Messines; he came from 54th Batth. His name was Bert and he was in A.Co. I Platoon and over me; he was nuggetty build and emart little chap. He was first wounded in the trench at Wessines on 7/6/17. I helped to bandage him up and save him a drink, he was quite conscious and sensible and did not seem to suffer much. I saw him the next morning when they were taking them away for burial. I do not think he suffered much.
