With reference to your enquiry concerning the late No. 2674 Pte. Still, I have to inform you that the man was admitted to this hospital suffering from severe Gunshot wound of the back, which penetrated the Abdomen and injured the liver. His condition was very unfavourable and gradually became worse. He passed away at 5.25 a.m. 29.10.17. The funeral service was conducted by the Rev. F.F. Kemlosy Chaplain of the Church of England and the body was interred in grave No. 663 B., Le Treport.
