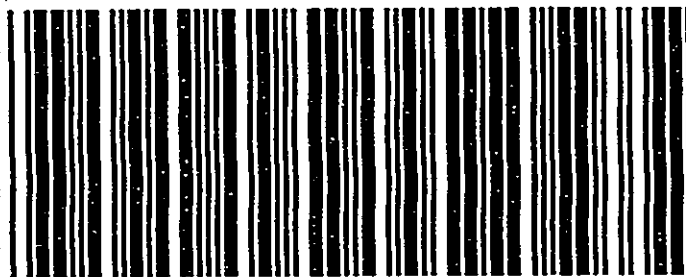

I know Gunner Arthur E. Talbot. He came from Perth. His father is in the Government Geologist Dept., W.A. He was killed along with Sergt. R. Newman of the 27th Battery at Chapelle, Armentieres in March 1917, and buried with him in a Military Cemetery to the right of Armentieres. There was to be a cross put on the grave.

At Brickfields Armentieres. Hit by a premature shell from our own guns. Hit stomach and chest, was bleeding internally. I was there when hit and helped to carry him to the stretcher out of line of guns.
