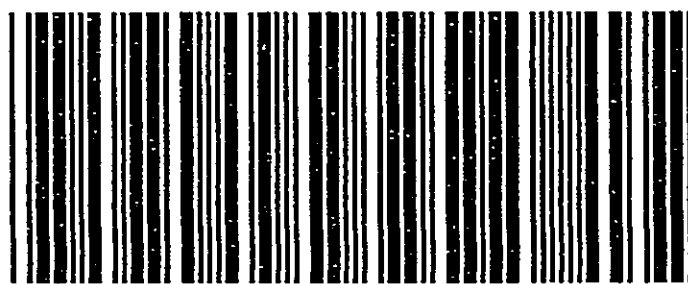

Spreadborough and Informant were both wounded on the Sunday afternoon, after landing, and went back to Egypt and Pte. S. then told Informant about Pte. Spilsbury.
