At Bullicourt 11/4/17, we were advancing at the time and I saw Lt. Thornley hit by a shell and killed instantly. We retired later and I saw his body still lying there. I could'nt say what became of his body afterwards.

On 11/4/17 the Battalien was in action at Bullicourt.

They happed ever early in the morning and made progress, but were afterwards driven back. About 2 p.m. after they had get back to their starting point a shell fell amongst a group of which the Lieutenant was a member and killed him outright. Informant was about 50 yards away and was wounded by the same shell.

According to Informant the Lieutenant was a most popular Officer.
