"MISSING 5-4-18"

I saw him wounded in the leg, ^{by a shell} during a heavy barrage, while in the reserve line, near Dernicourt, on the right of Albert, at about 8 a.m. on 5-4-18. I was wounded myself just after, and hear that the Germans took the trench soon afterwards. He was a Pte. in C.Coy. 11th Pltn., his number was 2502 (taken from entry in note book) and initials J.G. A dark, very quiet man of about 30 and 5'8".

I saw No.2502 Private Stevenson J.G. 47th Battalion, lying wounded through the leg in a trench on the morning of 5.4.18.

Stretcher bearers were present at the time, but I am unable to state whether Private Stevenson was attended to. I myself was wounded on the same day, and up to the time of my leaving the line, he had not been removed.

He seemed to be very badly wounded. I believe the enemy succeeded in taking some prisoners in that sector.
