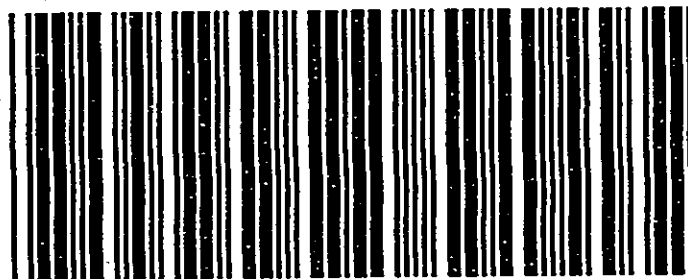

Pte Taylor was admitted to this Casualty Clearing Station on the 4th May suffering from shell wounds of the R. Tibia and Fibula and L. Buttock. He died on the following day. He left no message and was quite unconscious of his critical condition. He was buried in the local military cemetery on the 6th May.

Hall, going over. Called "Red". Just back from flighty
leave. Received a G.H.W. wound in the leg and another in the
head. Locality at the Villiers Bretonness Railway Station. It was
not in a turret. He was running out of a dugout for better
shelter. He was taken down to Dressing Station. Board word
came back to Boston that he died at a Casualty Clearing Station.
