Edwards and Corpl. Smith were both in my reinforcement and we were all three in B.Coy. On the night of March 1st, we were in a sunken road, which we called Twenty-Simil Avenue or Chalk Pit Road, citting on the embankment waiting to nue or and relieve the Battn. in the trenches, when a shell came in and killed Edwards outright and wounded Corpl. Emith, Corpl. Chapman and another Corporal whose name I do not remember. Corpl. Smith died the following day. I do not know where he and Edwards were buried.

He died on Harch 3rd. I don't know where he was buried.

Referring to your inquiry for Ho. 5305. Pte. F.H.A. Smith, 28th Battn. A.I.F. we beg to advise you of an unofficial report given by Ho. 8979. Pts. E. H. Gilbert who on April 27th. was in the 5rd Australian Auxiliary Hospital, Bertford.

Wounded in the legs by a high explosive shell and was carried on a stretcher to the second dressing station where informant heard the medical officer saying that he would not live long. He does not know where he was buried as he himself left before his death Trusting that these details will be of use and assuring you that every effort is being made to obtain a more definite report.

Dear Sir,

We beg to advise you of the rescipt of unofficial information concerning No. 5500 Fig. B. M. A. Spith. Ext. Batton A I.F., informat being many in his unit No. 5402 Fee Albert Smith.

He says that he are 1.3.4. Units on the night that he had been wounded in the head walking back to the Birst Aid Bressing Station. He must have be a wounded inter as he died of wounds at he advance Bressing Station two miles further every at Martingaich, his second injury being a free-tured thigh. In Terment pay his lying dead on a stratcher, and thinks that he must be buried semewhere close to the Dressing Station. He describes him is 25 pers of egg, 5 ft. 10 ins. in height, with dark hair. He came from Leederville, Vectorn Australia, and had been made a compare!

Holey 48th Batta. says, that Lt. Morris was wounded near Bapanne on April 11th 1917, and was taken to the Dressing Station, after which he does not know what happened.

Ho. 2070 I/Col. Unwin, who on May 9th was in the let Southern General Hospital, Birmingham, says that after the attack at dawn near Bullecourt on April 11th, he was walking along the German 2nd line trench, when he say the dead body of an officer who was identified by his batman in informant's presence, as It.Morris. They were compelled to retire from the position, and the bodies were left lying there. It.Morris, who was of medium height with a round face, had not been long with the battalion, having previously been wounded at Pozicres in
