

Tawell's body was found by Capt Sadler and search party in the vicinity of Hill 60 on The 28th October 1915. The body was buried, and the Chaplain of the 163rd Bgde. 54th Div. read the burial service. Tawell met his death during the first or second charge at Hill 60 on the 22nd or 27th August.

Witness found Tawell's disc on 28/11/15 at Hill 60. Tawell went out in the charge on 22/8/15 and did not return. (On the 28th Oct. witness, with/Doyle, Sergt.Sloper, Q.M.S.Craig and a few others went out by night as a search-party and with great difficulty and at considerable risk recovered some discs and other marks of identification.
