Informant states that on Wednesday August 11th at No. 2 Outpost on beach, Staff Sergt A.A. Kiernan was shot through the side and then taken immediately to the Field Mospital, from which Informant understood he was taken on board a Hospital boat. Informant was There were five of them together, when Staff with him at the time. Sergt Kiernan was wounded by a Machine Gun, and they carried him straight to the Tield Hospital themselves. If he fied afterwards it was not reported to the Regiment, which Informant did not have until several months later. Informant was very anxious for me to give you (Visitor's Note: He saw a notice in their Paper the "British this information. Australasia" 'arch 9th which said "Staff Sergt A.A.
