D/W. August 15th, 1916.

I helped to carry him from the trench to the D/S. He had a big shell wound in the right groin. He got the wound in an advanced post at Pozieres by a shell. It was 12 hours after before we could carry him out. Pte. J. Hudson, 18 A. helped me carry him out (still there). He did not speak except to ask us to be careful. We left him at the D/S and I know nothing further. He came over with me in the Lunic. We left January 20th, 1916, from Australia.

On the first week in Aug. he was wounded and I helped to carry him to the 1st Dressing Station at Pozieres. I have not seen or heard of him since. He was quite a boy not more than 16 or 17 years old, was a slim youth and came I believe, from Pyrmont, Sydney.
