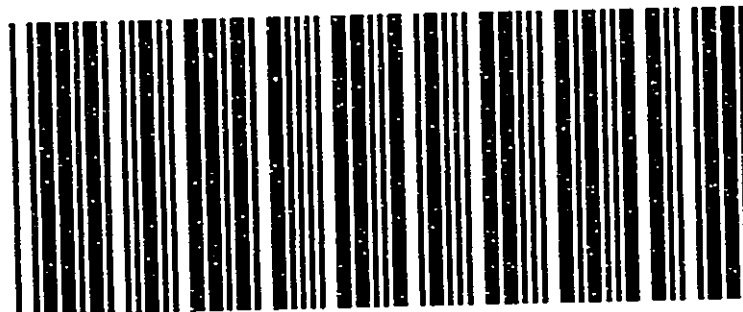

Reported Missing 25.7.16

I was in the same section as Pte Fewster. He was wounded in the attack on the German lines on the morning of the 25.7.16 when I last saw him he seemed to be badly wounded but still alive. I don't know what happened to him subsequently.
