I write you in reference  
to my Husband, Private George D. Jones  
up to last September 1917, I received  
my Husband's letters regularly every mail  
also his Mother, received a letter from  
him every mail, my last letter received  
from my Husband was dated 2<sup>nd</sup> of  
September, 1917, since receiving that letter  
I have had no word whatever, his  
company Mate 2963 Private George Martin  
51<sup>st</sup> Battalion, has stated in a letter to  
his Wife he saw my Husband crawl  
out of a shell hole. But he was unable  
to walk so he just said good bye  
& had to advance & leave my Husband  
lying there, that was some while in France  
he states that was between 7<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> of  
October, 1917, he believes now my Husband  
is reported as missing, I have done every-  
thing possible to get some news of  
my Husband, but the Military cannot
