# K. October 9th, 1917.

I have seen Lequesne's grave just behind Zonnebeke close to a railway cutting. I was about 300 or 400 yards behind our trench last November. He was buried with another man of his Coy. The grave was marked with a stick and his name written on in pencil. He came from Victoria. He was about 5 ft 11, very fair, rather stout. We called him Claude.
