I knew Casualty, he was dark, well built, 5'8" in height, about 27 years of age, known as "Kelly". He went away with the 14th. Reinforcements on the "Themistocles". We were advancing at Zonnebeke, Ypres, when he was killed by shell fire. I was right alongside him at the time of death, and saw his body lying in the open. I do not know if he was buried.

He was in C.Coy. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ came from Monbulk, Victoria. He was killed by a shell at Ypres pretty well blown to pieces while going up the line at night. His remains were recovered and buried on the spot. I do not know if his grave was marked. Kelly was a short, stout, thickset man, about 35.
