Collis was killed between Bullecourt and Norell about 10 yds from me: He was screwing a barb wire corkscrew when a shell dropped behind him and killed him outright. He was taken away and buried but I can't say where. The casualty was at Witness:- I. Belkan 14985 The casualty was at Boreil.

Informant describes Collis as about 6 ft. high, slight, dark, and aged about 23/24. He did not know where he came from

Informant states that on 7/5/17, Collis and he were in a party at Noreuil, near Bullecourt, which was westing for darkness to come on in order to fix barbed wire in the Australian front lines. They were in a sunken road, when just before dark a German shell burst near by and Collis was struck by a fragment of shell and instantly killed. Collis was buried in Noreuil Cemetery and Informant saw a cross with name, etc. painted thereon, which was intended to be placed on the grave although he did not actually see it in position.

"I know that Pte Gollie was killed instantaneously on the road whilst at duty. We were marching to put up a borbed wire entanglement when a "whizz-bang" shell exploded and hilled him. He was buried at Heuville near Yaulk, on the Somme in a cemetery; a cross was put up and his name on it. I was close by when Pte Collis was hit and saw him fall at 3.0 p.m."

"George". Casualty was being relieved from the front line to
Bullecourt when a shell exploded near Casualty killing him instantly.
I was 10 yds. from him at the time the shell exploded but I went
immediately to his assistance, but he was dead by the time I reached
him. He was buried close to where he fell in a small cemetery and
a cross was credted with his name and number on it. I was an
eye-witness."
