But in Movember 1916 I read in the Anzac Bulletin about him being prisoner and everyons that was in the same stunt as him at POzieres says he is a prisoner. Of course I can't say anything about that because I was not there, since then someone in this Battn gavd me his address. I Can't remember who it was but they told me they had a letter from one of their mates who saw him there, The address was 635226. Craig Gefangenen Lager. Dubren Camp Prisoner of War, West Germany. I am afraid my information is not much good to you but I never thought there was any dout about him not being a prisoner of War and everyone that knew him in this Battn is of the same opinion.
