Frank Emley and Jim Cheyne. They were missing in the middle of April at Bullecourt. They were both sent as runners with messages. Emley went first with a message to Headquarters. He did not return and the Cheyne was sent to deliver the message if Emley had never reached Headquarters, and to keep a lookout for Emley. But Cheyne too did not return. It was night time and they must either have been sniped or missed their way and got into the German German line, which was quite possible since we were in a sort of horse-shoe. I know them both/ well for they were in England with me and their numbers are similar to mine. JHA
