He took part in the same charge as informant on Aug 6th against the German Officer's trench. This attack was made from Quinn's Post. Carlson was running along close to informant when he fell either killed or wounded, and was not seen again. All the bodies of men who fell during this charge were left as it was certain death to venture out and recover them. Carlson was a great friend of informant's, they shared the same tent at Broadmeadows.

Witness states that Carlson was known as Alf. Carlson. Witness knew him well. Listed at Melbourne. Saw him fall in ~~the~~ ^{RA} ~~care~~ ^{care} at Lone Pine on 6th Aug. Positive that he was dead. He never moved after he fell. Carlson came over in the 6th Rfta. of the 6th Btn. Carlson was a bugler for the 6th Rfta. before landing on the Peninsula. Positive that this is the right man. Only 1 Carlson in B Co. Carlson was a young fellow, small, fair, very well liked.

L/Sgt. W. Don, B.Co. 6th.Bn. told witness in London, 6 or 7 weeks ago that Carlson was shot dead in front of the German officers' trench at Anzac. This occurred in a charge from Steele's Post, which took place on 6th.Aug. Carlson was a short, stentish fellow; he was a bugler on the boat coming over. He came from Melbourne. SA.
