All the bode dies of men who fell during this charge were left as it was certain death to venture out and recover them. Carlson was a great friend of informant's, they shared the same tent at broadmendows.

To never moved after he fell. Carlson came over in the 6th Rft's, of the 6th Btr. Carlson was a bugler for the 6th Rft s. before landing on the Peninsula. Positive that this is the right man. Only 1 Carlson in B Co. Carbson was a young fellow, small, fair, very well liked.
