

### "Killed in Action" 24-4-18.

He was in C. Company and I saw him killed villiers
Bratonneux, when he was bit by a piece of bomblon the side of
chest and was killed instantly. We were attacking at time of
dasualty about 11; p.m. on April 24th 1918. I knew him well, and
he came from Claremont. Western Australia. I was wounded the
same time and cannot give any details of his burial nor can I refer
to anyone.

I knew himsell; he came from Claremont. & was a son of a Pastoralist. On April 24th. about 10. p.m. we attacked. Higham was in the same section as I. We got about 2 or 300 yards when he was hit by a M. G. Bullet & killed right out. I saw this & I heard that he was afterwards buried in the open in fronttof Villiers Brettoneux.

### "killed 24-4-18."

"On April 25th 1918 we were doing a hop-over at Villers Bretonneux, pushing back the Hun, when Higham was killed by a bullet. He was buried where he fell and his grave is marked by a cross with his name and regiment, and the date when he fell. The ground was held.

In further answer to your enquiry for 3870 Ptc.H.HIGHAN. 51st Estation, A.L.E.
We beg to inform you we have received some unofficial information
confirming previous reports we have sent you.

3956 Pte.C. Hoore interviewed while in a convalencent Camp in France states that he know to. Higher well and that he came from Claremont and was the son of a Pastoralist. When they were attacked about 10 p.m. on 24-4-18 they were in the same section. They got about 300 yards when Pte.Higham was hit by a machine gun bullet and killed instantaneously. Informant saw the casualty and hearline was afterwards buried in the open in front of Villers Bretonneux.

Trusting this information may be of some assistance.

With further reference to your letter of 25/5/18 enquiring for 3870 Pte. H. Higham 51st Battalion, A.I.F., we beg to inform you of an unofficial report of his death which we have now received from one of the men in his unit. 3382 Pte. A. W. Cook interviewed recently at 3rd Australian Auxiliary Hospital Dartford stated that he knew Pte. Higham well and that he came from Claremont Western Australia. On April 24th. at about 11 p.m. they were attacking at Villers Bretonneux and Pte. Higham was wounded in the side of the chest by a piece of a bomb and killed instantaneously. Our informent was wounded at the same time and is therefore unable to give information as to his burial.

We are continuing our enquiries and will do our utmost to obtain further particulars as soon as we do so, we will immediate. ly advise you.
